

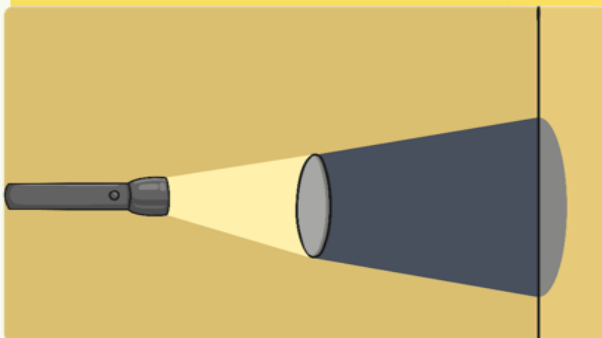


Making Shadows

Shadows are created when an opaque object (an object that doesn't let light pass through it) blocks light. Shadows can be all shapes and sizes.

The light cannot go through or around the object, so a darker patch of less light is created behind the object.

Shadows are not reflections! Reflection is when light bounces off an object. A shadow is caused by light being blocked so a shadow is an absence of light.

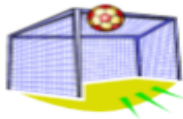

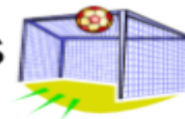
