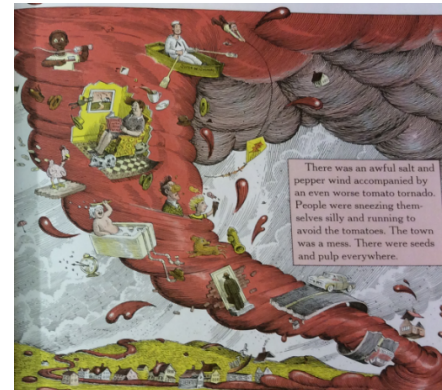
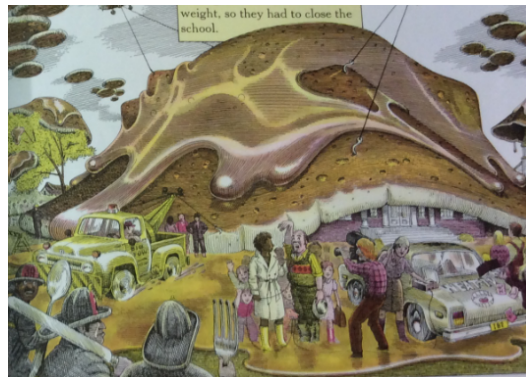
Read this extract from the book carefully.

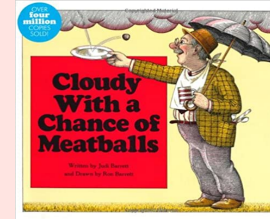

Remember, find the answer in the text first.

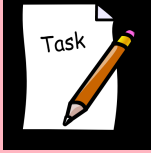

Why do you think the birds didn't eat all of the bread?

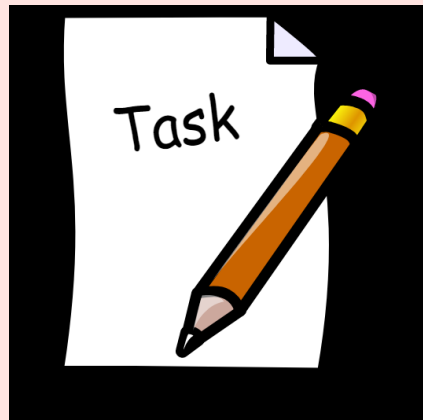


Read this part of the story again.
