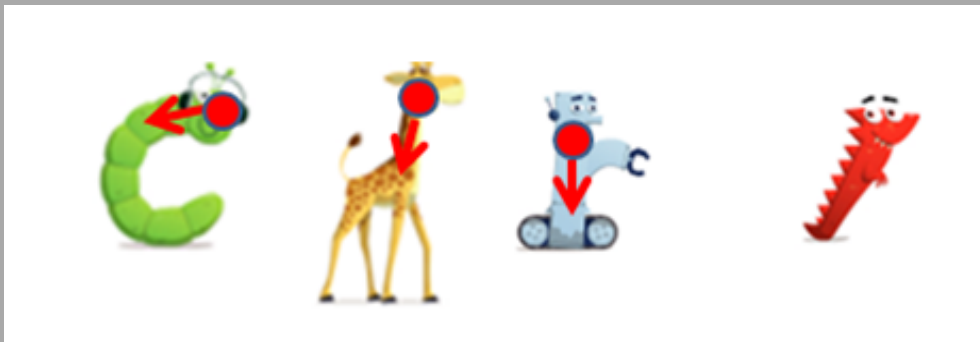

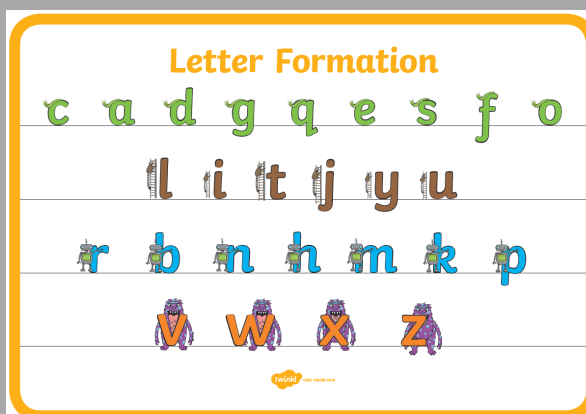
Most of my lower case, capital letters and numerals (0-9) are written in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.

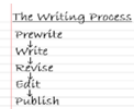
Our Learning Objectives:

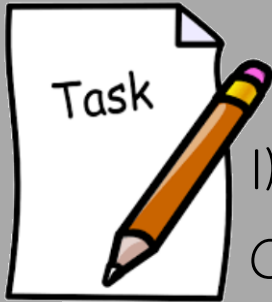
