English

During this term, both Years 5 and 6 will be using their geographical and historical skills when studying natural disasters. They will be creating their own persuasive leaflet to try and encourage people to live in the foothills of a volcano! They will also then be creating their own narrative based around the devastating tsunami that struck Japan in 2011. They will be using dialogue to advance the action!

Forest School

This term, we will be having a Forest School day every Week 1 (Monday) and a Forest School afternoon every Week 2 (Monday). Pupils must attend school wearing suitable outdoor clothing (not school uniform) for the whole day. This will allow students to experience a range of activities including foraging, fire lighting and using tools. We will be linking some of our Forest School sessions to our Natural Disasters topic.

Topic: Natural Disasters

This term Years 5 and 6 will be exploring natural disasters from all around the world. They will be studying what causes them, what the effects of them are and how we may be able to reduce the impact they have. Already on our transition days our pupils built 'earthquake proof' buildings with great success. We look forward to challenging them even further!

Science/French/Computing

Within science, pupils will be working scientifically to develop their own hypotheses, methodology and conclusions based on gathered evidence. This will be done through a range of exciting experiments exploring different aspects of science—starting with natural disasters!

In French, we will be developing our knowledge of being able to talk all about ourselves:

In computing, we will begin by looking at E-safety and how our pupils can ensure they are using the internet safely and effectively.

Homework
