Bradford Science and Media Museum

Dear Parent/Carer,

UKS2 pupils' topics this term in science include: light, earth and space. To fully immerse ourselves in these captivating areas of science, we have booked a trip to the Bradford Science and Media Museum. This museum offers a dedicated schools programme that brings the subjects of science, history, and art to life through interactive exhibits. We believe that the hands-on experiences provided by the museum will complement our ongoing science topics and greatly enhance the children's understanding of these complex topics.

The trip will take place across two different dates. Please see below:

Year 5: Wednesday 19th March **Year 6**: Wednesday 26th March

Whilst there, pupils will participate in a range of activities and experiences. This will include, a workshop that will weave together science, education and entertainment. Also, we will visit their IMAX 3-D experience to watch, "Journey to space." This viewing experience will take us on a journey through the stratosphere with an inspiring look at the wonder of space travel. Additionally, we will visit the various galleries which will explore light, sound and photography.

The cost of the trip, which covers all of the above plus coach transport, is £15 which will be added to ParentPay. Pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding are entitled to an additional half price reduction making the cost £7.50. This will be reflected on ParentPay. Payment for the trip will be regarded as permission is given.

If you pay for your child's school dinners, they will need to bring a packed lunch with them for the trip. Children who have packed lunches in school will also need to bring their usual packed lunch. If your child receives Free School Meals, they will be provided with a packed lunch by school.

We are aiming to arrive back between 3:30-3:40pm but will send an update to school if this is going to be earlier or later. We will follow usual home time procedures. If your child normally has permission to walk home, they will walk as normal. Any children who are collected or who attend Beehive, will do this as normal.
