<b>Science</b>	Select a mammal, amphibian, insect, or bird and create an information booklet about each life stage, including habitat and diet. <b>History</b>	Create a timeline that outlines significant events and achievements in Early Islamic Civilisation.	Create a fact file about a key individual from the Early Islamic Civilisation.	Research the mighty city of Ur and its Ziggurat temple. Create a 3D model that is labelled with facts.
<b>Geography</b>	Create a map which locates key places connected with the Early Islamic Civilisation.	Create a fact file about the physical and human features of the Silk Road.	Compare and contrast the geographical features of ancient Baghdad and modern-day Baghdad.
<b>Art/DT</b>	Research traditional dishes from the Early Islamic period.	Research Arabic calligraphy and create your own poster or creation using the art of calligraphy.	Create a 3D model of the city of Baghdad, highlighting important features and structures from the Early Islamic Civilisation.
